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Our Curriculum

At Fairfield we provide a safe, nurturing environment and strive to inspire children so that they develop intellectually, physically and creatively by ensuring that all pupils have equal access to high-quality teaching and learning that they deserve.

Children enjoy learning at Fairfield and have a fantastic attitude to learning that only serves to encourage them to make good progress in their development both socially and academically.

We aim to make our curriculum meaningful, interesting and fun, including real experiences for the children to enrich their development and understanding. Our aims and values encompass British values of expecting high effort, understanding and tolerance of others and high values of respect and behaviour.

We have ensured our curriculum places literacy and numeracy at the forefront although as always, we promote the fact that all subjects have their rightful place within the curriculum. We have ensured that the curriculum we offer your child is balanced, exciting and enriched and fully equips your child with knowledge, skills, tolerance and understanding of the 21st century world.

We aim to offer opportunities for all pupils to excel. To achieve this, we have taken great care in the way we have organised our curriculum and use a knowledge and vocabulary based approach, enabling children to make links within their learning across year groups and subjects. At Fairfield, we work hard to ensure children remember what they are taught in the long term which we hope will greatly enhance children's understanding of the world and make learning new concepts easier and more enjoyable.









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Learning and Pastoral Support

Fairfield is recognised as providing good provision for pupils with SEN or those who are more and very able across the curriculum. We have a strong team who work to ensure that all pupils' needs are addressed. We are proactive and aim to identify needs as soon as possible in order to target early intervention and support.

Our SENCo manages the SEN teaching assistants who are deployed throughout the school to provide additional support where needed. Some are attached to pupils with a statement or Education Health Care plan while others are used to target groups of pupils who require varying degrees of additional support. We work closely with outside agencies such as speech and language, autism outreach and sight and hearing impairment units to develop learning programmes and appropriate provision for our pupils.

We ensure all staff have appropriate training when necessary to implement support packages.

The school is committed to safeguarding and prompting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.









What Makes Us Unique

Sport

We actively embrace coaching opportunities from local sports clubs and organisations, providing diverse sporting experiences for our students. Various year groups benefit from expert guidance in football, netball, rugby, cricket, athletics, dance, hockey, gymnastics and judo.

At Fairfield, our students have numerous avenues for competitive participation. Internal competitions, like Sports Day, engage all pupils. Additionally, children can proudly represent the school in local leagues through our football, netball, basketball and cross country teams. We also enter various competitions, including tag rugby, area athletics and quick-sticks hockey, fostering a culture of sportsmanship and achievement.

Music

Music is integral to our curriculum, offering children the chance to nurture their interests and skills. Our thriving choir, regular performers at assemblies and local events, exemplifies this passion. Year 4 students receive instrument instruction, with the option for private tutoring facilitated by Leicestershire Schools Music Service. Past highlights include Year 4 performances at De Montfort Hall. Fairfield has proudly earned the 'Bronze' award from the Leicestershire Schools Music Service, acknowledging our dedication to enhancing music education quality.









What Makes Us Unique

Happy Luchtimes

Our Happy Lunchtimes Award encourages children to play a variety of games at lunchtimes and develop their social and emotional skills. Every Friday the children's social achievements are celebrated in our celebration assembly for those children who have shown outstanding behaviour.

Residentials

Each year we have taken the Year 4 children to Kingswood (West Runton) in Norfolk for a 3 day, 2 nights, activity centre. Year 6 children currently visit York for a residential where they learn a lot about themselves as they prepare to move on to high school as well as having some first-hand experiences of concepts they have studied in the curriculum throughout their time at Fairfield.. Both of these residential trips are well attended and provide incredible opportunities that children remember and talk about with great enjoyment for a long time after they return home.

School Council

The school council is formed by pupils putting themselves forward for election and then being voted in by their classes. The members are involved in all aspects of school life such as interviewing, competitions, helping with decisions made by governors and committees, attending school conferences, anti-bullying days, supporting the safety and wellbeing of all in school and much more.

Wider Opportunities

At Fairfield, we prioritise success and self-esteem in every child. Beyond the standard curriculum, we offer enriching opportunities that foster learning and community integration. Each year, students perform themed shows for their families and enjoy trips to places of interest, visits from experts, and unique experiences like circus skills, museum visits, and meeting championship athletes. We end the year with a festive trip to a traditional Christmas Panto at De Montfort Hall.









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Our Wrap around Care

We are fortunate to have full school wrap around care with our Breakfast Club managed by our support staff team, and our After School Care Provision managed by Football & Fitness.

Games, play and fun are on offer every school day in a nurturing environment. Children benefit from 'growing up' and working with the wrap around team every day.

From 7:45am including breakfast.


